EVERYONE is welcome at the MAPAS Centre. We are here for the whole community of Salford, regardless of age, disability, gender, race, religion, sex or sexual orientation.

When we are at the MAPAS Centre, we:

- Welcome new members and show them kindness.
- Show respect (e.g. don't speak when other people are talking, pay attention, take turns). Respect works both ways and is shown by our members and our tutors.
- Are kind and help people if they are unsure.
- Are patient with people who are learning and might make mistakes.
- Use our words to support each other, not to insult or hurt each other.
- Can wear whatever we feel comfortable in. For concerts we might be asked to wear a certain colour but we can still choose to wear whatever we like in that colour.
- Practice what we are learning in between rehearsals.
- Are responsible for our own instrument, music and scripts and we come to our rehearsals prepared.
- Welcome feedback from our tutors so that we know how to improve.
- Work hard. We love what we do, and our tutors challenge our members, but always in a supportive and progressive way.
- Have fun! Members come to the centre by choice so we are a bit more relaxed than at school!
